Subject : Transfer of schools from Central Tibetan Schools Administration (CTSA) to Department of Education, Central Tibetan Administration (CTA).

The issue of transfer of schools run by Central Tibetan Schools Administration (CTSA) to the Department of Education, Central Tibetan Administration (CTA) was under consideration of the Government. The Government has taken the following decisions with regard to the transfer of schools run by CTSA to the Deptt. of Education, CTA:

- (i) transfer of schools run by CTSA to Department of Education, Central Tibetan Administration or any registered society run by DoE, CTA over a three year period as decided by DoE, CTA.
- (ii) giving an option to Indian teaching and non-teaching staff of CTSA to join KVS/NVS/CBSE/Demonstration schools of NCERT as and when CTSA schools are transferred to DoE, CTA.
- (iii) ensuring that the Indian academic and non-academic staff who opt to remain in CTSA, and the Tibetan origin staff of CTSA, will work under DoE, CTA on terms and conditions of employment not inferior to the terms and conditions under CTSA.
- (iv) providing funds at the rate of Rs.43 Crore per annum plus an annual increment of 5% to DoE, CTA for running the schools proposed to be transferred to CTA from CTSA and for meeting any other related expenditure provided the number of students remain the same i.e. 2220 residential students and 6455 day scholars. The funds would be reduced pro-rata in case of any reduction in student strength. During the transition period of 3 years, the grant would be paid on a pro-rata basis depending on the number of schools transferred and the enrolment in these schools.
- (v) the present Indian students shall continue their education in the same school. The provision of upto 10% Indian students shall continue after transfer. The existing quota for non-Tibetan children shall not be reduced without reference to MHRD/MEA.

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- (vi) providing for the pensionary liability of all retired CTSA employees, pensionary liability of CTSA employees who opt to join other organizations in accordance with CCS (Pension) Rules and for the future pensionary liability of such present CTSA employees who opt to remain in the service of DoE, CTA.
- (vii) transferring immoveable assets other than land from CTSA to DoE, CTA through long term renewable lease at a token lease rental in cases where the land belongs to CTSA or is leased to CTA and transfer of all moveable assets from CTSA to DoE, CTA at book value. In case the land belongs to a State Government/other Organization, and is leased to CTSA, the immovable assets will be transferred to CTA only after obtaining consent of the concerned State Government/organization.
- (viii) empowering the Ministry of Human Resource Development to issue guidelines on issues like absorption of employees, transfer of assets, pensions, post transfer issues related to CTSA and any other residuary issues.

2. The transfer of the schools is to take place over a three year period. The Director, CTSA and Director, Deptt. of Education, CTA may provide a timeframe for the transfer of CTSA schools and firm up the modalities of the transfer under intimation to the Department of School Education & Literacy, Ministry of Human Resource Development.
